Boise State University

Located in downtown Boise, BSU is the largest university in Idaho. More than 25,000 students are enrolled across 200 areas of study. The most popular fields are health careers and business. BSU also has the largest graduate school in Idaho with more than 300 graduate programs as well as PhD programs. US News ranks the university at #176 in Top Public Schools in the country.

University of Idaho - Boise Campus

U of I is the state's largest land-grant university. The Boise campus is downtown on East Front Street. U of I has been the US News #1 Best Value Public University in the West for four years in a row. The Boise campus offers 30 degrees in areas including science, healthcare and agriculture. U of I offers more scholarships than any other public university in Idaho.

Idaho State University - Meridian Campus

Meridian is home to the ISU Health Science Center with more than 30 undergrad and graduate programs, including online degrees focused on health and emergency services. The Center operates clinics in various disciplines from mental health to occupational therapy.

The College of Idaho

This is the oldest private liberal arts college in the state. Located off Cleveland Blvd. in Caldwell, the college has about 1,100 students. Forbes ranked The College of Idaho as the top school of higher education in Idaho. Students have a 100% acceptance rate to law schools and 85% acceptance to medical schools.

College of Western Idaho

As a community college, CWI offers career and technical courses and certificates in addition to two- and four-year academic degrees. It also has a GED prep program and dual credit for high school students. There are two Treasure Valley campuses in Boise and Nampa.

Northwest Nazarene University

NNU is a private non-profit Christian liberal arts school in Nampa. It is ranked as the #22

Best Value School in the West.

Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine (ICOM)

The Idaho College of Osteopathic Medicine (ICOM) is the state's first medical school. Located in Meridian, ICOM offers a comprehensive Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) program. The curriculum integrates rigorous scientific coursework with extensive clinical training, preparing students to meet the diverse healthcare needs of the region. ICOM is a pivotal institution in improving healthcare access and quality in Idaho and beyond.

University of Dubuque - Meridian

Even though people do often confuse Iowa and Idaho, there is, in fact, a University of Dubuque located in Meridian, Idaho! This Christian-based university offers adult and accelerated degrees through the LIFE program.

Eagle Gate College and Carrington College

Eagle Gate College and Carrington College in Boise specialize in healthcare education. Eagle Gate offers certificates through master's degrees in nursing and allied health careers. Carrington is a private for-profit school awarding associate's degrees.
